

The Grad Ceremony will be held at the Sanderson Centre on Thurs. June 26 at 7pm. Graduates MUST arrive by 6pm already wearing their green grad gown & stole and assemble in alphabetical order for the procession. To be admitted to the Sanderson Centre grads MUST show their WHITE PASS at the 1st General Admission Entrance Door on Darling Street. Upon arrival, grads will proceed to the Rehearsal Room to sign in for attendance & do a quick check in their gown & stole. Grads are asked to dress in business casual attire-including appropriate footwear for such an occasion and please no shorts. Grads <u>do not</u> return their gowns or stoles after the ceremony as they purchased them with their grad fee and are encouraged to take pictures outside the Sanderson Centre after the ceremony has finished.

#### DO NOT BRING ANY VALUABLES TO EITHER THE REHEARSAL OR CEREMONY AS THEY CANNOT BE LOCKED UP.



### GUEST PASSES ~IMPORTANT INFO~

Grads must show their WHITE PASS and guests must show their EMBOSSED BLUE PASS to be admitted to the Sanderson Centre the night of the ceremony. Due to the size of the graduating class, the number of guest passes have been limited to THREE, unless you received an additional guest pass through the lottery process that already took place. This meets the maximum number of people allowed in the Sanderson Centre under fire regulations. This is the reason guests will <u>not</u> be admitted without a pass and the Sanderson Centre staff will be collecting the embossed passes at the doors.

# FINAL DETAILS

### • PRINCIPAL'S HONOUR ROLL CRITERIA:

Grade 12 students who qualify must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 courses and must achieve a minimum overall average of 80% with their best six courses. These courses must be taken with the BHNCDSB in the current academic year, from July 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025. One course in Religion must also be taken as part of this complement.

### • ONTARIO SCHOLAR:

A student who obtains a total of at least 480 marks in any combination of Ministry approved Gr. 12 courses having a total of six credits and who has been recommended by his or her principal for the OSSD in either the current school year or the previous school year, may be designated an Ontario Scholar.
