## Chicago Style

## **General Rules**

- Double -space the entire text with the exception on the bibliography (leave a space between entries) and block quotations
- Block quotations longer than five lines should be indented by .5 inch and single spaced. DO NOT place quotation marks around a blocked quotation.
- Number all pages at the top of the page either in the centre or justifies to the right margin.
- Indent new paragraphs.
- The title Bibliography should appear centred at the top of the page. Do not underline, italicize, or bold the word.
- List all entries in alphabetical order according to the first word in the entry.
- You do not number the entries.
- Single space each entry, but leave an extra space between entries.

## **Footnotes**

Footnotes are used to acknowledge that you borrowed from another piece of work.

You must cite a work when you use a quote or derive facts or ideas from it, even if you have not summarized, quoted or paraphrase the information.

Every citation in your work must have a footnote and a corresponding entry in the bibliography. Footnotes appear at the end of the page. You will have to have a subscript number for each entry. The subscript number will be placed at the end of the sentence in which the source is referenced, after the punctuation. Begin with the number "1". DO NOT use roman numerals. Do not start the order over on each page, continue numerically throughout the paper.
